Daniel Sundahl (DanSun) is a retired Paramedic/Firefighter and worked as a First Responder for over 20 years. In 2014, after his PTSD diagnosis, Daniel began using Art as a way to get the trauma he experienced out of his head. This began as a way to help himself. He thought if he were to ever share the Art with others, he would be ridiculed and disgraced for it. Quite the opposite happened. The result of Daniel's Artwork was life changing for Daniel, and for those viewing his art. The majority of Daniel's work involves emergency services imagery. It comprises an emotional connection to the artist as most of his pieces are based on actual emergency calls he has attended as a Paramedic and Firefighter. The pieces have connected visually, spiritually, and emotionally to people from all walks

of life, not just First Responders. The piece above is called *TORN*, and is one of Daniel's most popular pieces. The man in the middle has likely seen too much, done too much, experienced too much and is numb. Numb is a dangerous place to be, and too many have given in to the evil that comes for you. But when we can't ask for help, others step in and fight for us. Daniel is passionate about reducing the stigma of PTSD for First Responders and uses his art to raise awareness of occupational stress injuries worldwide. Daniel is a registered counseling therapist and the president and founder of The Recovery and Resiliency Foundation, a charitable organization that helps support people living with symptoms of trauma. Daniel is a published artist and writer with four (4) art books produced of his works. Articles of his work are featured in several international publications, and his art is recognized and exhibited worldwide. Daniel now works full-time as an artist, counselor and public speaker.
